Thank goodness

Year 3

The children learned about how light travels and where it comes from. During the assembly it got very exciting because all the children and adults got a torch and saw on the computer screen how the light travelled from the torches. We talked about how the sun is our main light source and had a go at recreating it ourselves by putting hydrogen inside and applied heat. The balloon then exploded!

In class, we built towers using opaque, translucent and transparent blocks. The children got to see what happened to the shadows of their towers, when they used the different objects.

By the end of the day, the children understood that to be a scientist you need to have the 3Cs - Curiosity, Creativity and Commitment. Three qualities which we all showed throughout the day.


