# Year 4 and 5 Sound Day






Years 4 and 5 had a visit from the Science Media Museum. This included a sound assembly learning about what sound is followed by class workshops.

In the assembly, children learnt about how sound travels in waves and how sound effects in films can be made from normal day to day objects. They enjoyed taking part in quizzes and making rain sounds using their feet and hands.

When in class, the children were able to work in teams to put sound effects to a short clip. They had to carefully choose the objects which would match the sound effect. For example, some children used their voices to record the steps of an animal but some used a musical instrument. The teams then had chance to work with the recording equipment to record their sounds effects. After which, we played the short clip again with their sound effects. The children thoroughly enjoyed the workshops as you can see from the photos.
