


Nursery

Nursery have been learning about the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' The children have drawn pictures of the characters in the story – the bear and the family and some of the different settings – such as the cave. The children have enjoyed telling the story with toys, making binoculars to help them find the bear and going on bear hunts around the school grounds. We used tubes and tape to make the binoculars and then the children decided if they wanted to decorate them with paint or collage materials.

When we went bear hunting the children used words from the book as we went through the different settings.' Swish swash, swish swash' for the long wavy grass and 'Stumble trip, stumble trip' for the deep dark woods.

We have been able to access the woods whilst the EYFS play area is being constructed and have enjoyed some Forest School activities including potions making. We used coloured water, herb, flowers, leaves and sometimes mud. We enjoyed playing in the hammocks, blowing bubbles and climbing trees.
